



## Information for New Players and Families

### Registration and Fees

Using the Aspen student information system, the winter sports registration must be completed. Ensure a current physical report is on file with the Athletic Director's office and submit the annual athletic fee if it has not already been paid for a fall sport.

### Uniforms and Equipment

Game jerseys, practice jerseys, pant shells and socks are provided and must be returned at the end of the season. All other equipment, including helmet, pads, skates, mouthguard and hockey sticks are the responsibility of the player.

### Warm-Up Suits and Hockey Bags

Players will receive a warm-up suit to wear to games and a hockey bag. The cost of the items is split between the player and the Boosters.

### Transportation to Practices

When possible, the younger players carpool to practice with the older driving players. For the 19-20 school year, there are fewer drivers than usual. The coaches have arranged to use the school van to transport players to practice. If your player is carpooling with another player, plan to contribute towards the driver's expenses and time.

### Transportation to Games

Players will need their own transportation to games played at Hobomock. For away games, there is a bus. Players are expected to take the bus both to and from the game. For games that are played on the Cape, pizza will be provided for the ride home.

### Alumni Game

Prior to the official start of the season, the players are encouraged to participate in the annual Alumni game where the current and future players team up against our

returning alumni players. The game is held the Friday after Thanksgiving at Hobomock arena.

### Friday Night Pasta Parties

A pasta party is hosted each Friday before a game by one of the families. A sign-up sheet will be made available early in the season. Alternately, you can sign up to provide pizza for an away Cape game (ordering, purchasing and ensuring delivery of the pizza).

### Fundraising

Players are expected to participate in all fund-raising activities. The Boosters subsidize or cover the costs in full for ice time, travel, the Green Cup tournament, off-ice training, summer league, team apparel, scholarships and celebrating our players with a Senior recognition night and an end of season banquet.

### Community Involvement

The MHS Girls Hockey Team understands the importance of community involvement and regularly gives back to Marshfield, including participating in the Community Christmas telethon, the Molly Fund Walk and Youth Hockey clinics.
